COURSE OFFERINGS 16 HOUR CLASSES SATURDAY AND SUNDAY MARCH 14—15, 2020

PUMP OPERATIONS I (PUOP)

FSC 420.001

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose lines, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

PUMP OPERATIONS II (PUOA)

FSC 421.001

PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

FORCIBLE ENTRY (TFE)

FSC 700.001

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER.

MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS (ECOP)

FSC 205.001

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT.

MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE I (RORE)

FSC 340.001

PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA BY THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles), CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND A CLASS III HARNESS.

FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS. (Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

Students in this course will be introduced to the various types of rope and related rescue equipment. Students will be training in tying of the basic knots and hitches used in rope rescue, basic rappelling techniques, tie-offs, self-rescue, basic litter tie-ins, and basic litter handling skills. Much of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I (TRCO)

FSC 209.001

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR EQUIVILANT / TRUCK 1

MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

The student will be introduced to the basic concept of truck company operations as part of an organized, coordinated structural fire suppression operation. Truck companies, regardless of whether they arrive on an aerial device, squad, or engine, are the 'combat engineers' of fire attack operations. This course, for experienced fire fighters, will introduce the student to the basic concept of truck company operations and duties, including organizing the delivery of truck company services, selection and use of key tools, advanced ventilation and forcible entry theory and practices, search and rescue, and other fire attack support functions.

BASIC FIRE POLICE (BFPO)

FSC 0604.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

This course provides instruction on the proper method to be appointed, the laws pertaining to fire police, fire police powers, and the expected duties of a new fire police officer.

INTRO TO FIREOFFICERSHIP (INFO)

FSC 0226.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

This course will give those students wishing to become Fire Officers, the ability to function safely and effectively as a management component of a fire/rescue organization. Effective management skills and styles will be covered as well as effective communications, progressive discipline, philosophy of management, organizational skills, and Company Officer strategy and tactical considerations.

SCBA BOOTCAMP

FSC 0307.001

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR / SCBA / SPARE CYLINDER

Designed for the skilled firefighter, this course will enforce skills and challenge firefighters in the rigors of utilizing their self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) during interior structural firefighting. The students will be presented with various scenarios which are encountered in the firefighting environment, such as 'low air' air management and SCBA emergencies. The student will engage in intensive situations which will serve as a proficiency self-evaluation of their capabilities of SCBA use in structural firefighting. The veteran firefighter, not to be feeling left out, will be pushed to challenge the limits of their skill set in real world examples of SCBA use and structural firefighting challenges.

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE (ELIS)

FSC 2459.001 / 2459.002

PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 14 YEARS OF AGE BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

This entry level course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment, tools and emergency lighting, and backing apparatus. This is the first of five levels (courses) in the curriculum

SATURDAY MORNING CLASSES

RAMP PROGRAM (PLCB)

FSC 9219.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY AM (3HR CLASS)

PREREQUISITES: 21 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

RAMP Server/Seller Training consists of training for a licensee's alcohol service staff (this includes anyone who serves alcoholic beverages and / or checks IDs.) All Alcohol service personnel hired after August 8, 2016, who are not RAMP server / seller trained, must be RAMP server / seller trained within six months of being hired. Employees who are not currently considered alcohol service personnel but are transferred into an alcohol server/seller trained within six months of assuming their new duties. Any existing and newly-hired alcohol service personnel who are currently RAMP server/seller trained must be retrained when their training expires. All cashiers selling wine at an establishment with a wine expanded permit must be RAMP server/seller trained. If a licensee obtains an off-premises catering permit for use at a catered function, every employee whose primary responsibility at the catered function is to sell and/or serve alcoholic beverages or check identifications of those seeking to enter the catered function must have successfully completed server/seller training within two years prior to the date of the catered function. Students must be at least age 18 years of age by first day of class.

TRAFFIC INCIDENT MANAGEMENT (TIM)

FSC 0214.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY AM (4HR CLASS)

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This National TIM Responder Training Program establishes the foundation and promotes consistent training for all responders to incident involving operations on or near a highway. The PA – TIM objectives primarily target operations and special risks to personnel performing fire, rescue and EMS functions. This program examines the risks and provides nationally recognized actions to minimize/reduce those risks.

WINCH OPERATIONS

FSC 590.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY AM (4HR CLASS)

PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

Through lecture and hands-on integrated training exercises, this course will assist the student with safe and effective operation of a winch. Key safety elements will provide risk reduction strategies for maintaining a safe and effective rescue ground. This course was developed for rescue/extrication personnel exposed to winch operations for the purpose of recovery and stabilization. This course reviews strategic and tactical considerations for winch operations during an incident, inspection points for a comprehensive preventive maintenance schedule, and critical safety elements. Through integrated training scenarios, the student will implement lesson objectives.

CLANDESTINE DRUG LABS AWARENESS

FSC 827.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY AM (3HR CLASS)

PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This program is designed to provide First Responders with the basic recognition and identification skills for clandestine laboratories and the dangers associated with the chemicals used to manufacture illegal drugs. The topics of discussion will include personnel safety when operating at these locations, hazardous materials and wastes produced and required interaction with law enforcement. Participants must be current members of a recognized First Response agency.

SATURDAY 8 HR CLASSES

HEAVY TRUCK RESCUE (8 HR CLASS) (MAX 20 STUDENTS PER SESSION)

FSC 0622.001

PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER,

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

This program addresses the hazards and resource demands for extrication emergencies involving large and heavy vehicles. Addressed in this program, are vehicle design considerations, weight distribution hazards, payloads, strength points, and special hazard considerations. The course teaches the student how to assess, stabilize, and access vehicles of greater size and weight. Students will learn how to address special resource needs encountered during extrication emergencies.

VEHICLE EXTRICATION STRATEGIES AND TACTICS (8 HR CLASS) (MAX 20 STUDENTS PER SESSION)

FSC 2474.001

PREREQUISITES: STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course will provide an awareness level of information and skills as it pertains to vehicle rescue incidents. Topics will include general vehicle rescue function/operation; incident management of the vehicle accident/rescue incident; vehicle anatomy, design, and construction; recognition and control of hazards relative to a vehicle accident/rescue incident; and the tools and equipment used at a vehicle accident/rescue incident.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON CLASSES

**FIRST CONTACT TO THE COMMUNITY REPORT-
THE ISO COMMUNITY SURVEY**

FSC 1901.007

This class is intended for all fire service personnel and community officials. It is an overall review of the process of surveying a community's fire suppression capabilities as it will apply to property insurance for commercial and residential properties. It starts from the first contact to the community by the ISO Field Representative (FR). It then reviews what occurs during the pre-survey phase-assisting with preparing the community for a survey. The training will discuss what the FR will be reviewing and the meetings that will occur. There will be an overview of the Fire Suppression Rating Schedule and associated documents and, finally, what happens after the FR leaves. The process of publishing the grading through our National Processing Center and the community report will also be discussed.

ELEVATOR AWARENESS

FSC 0595.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY PM (4 HR CLASS)

This 4-hour course addresses the steps to provide responders with hazard assessment and equipment identification skills at emergencies involving elevators. This course is an awareness level course intended for fire and rescue personnel to provide them the ability to function, accurately, safely, and effectively during rescue incidents involving this mode of public transportation. Topics include: pre-incident planning, hazard assessment and size-up, resource considerations, equipment identification, and lockout/tagout procedures. Students must be at least age 18 by first day of class.

EMERGENCY REPORTING FOR THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 9118.007 CLASS IS ON SUNDAY PM (4 HR CLASS)

This 4 hour education session will show participants how to utilize Emergency Reporting for completing incident reports and submitting incidents into PennFIRS from other incident reporting programs.

FENTANYL AWARENESS

FSC 830.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY AM (3HR CLASS)

PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This program is designed to provide First Responders with the basic recognition and identification skills for clandestine laboratories and the dangers associated with the chemicals used to manufacture illegal drugs. The topics of discussion will include personnel safety when operating at these locations, hazardous materials and wastes produced and required interaction with law enforcement. Participants must be current members of a recognized First Response agency.

COURSE OFFERINGS SUNDAY MARCH 15, 2020

SUNDAY MORNING CLASSES

WATER RESCUE AWARENESS (WRFRA)

FSC 0580.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY AM (3HR CLASS)
PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS
GEAR: NONE

This program discusses the characteristics of water-related emergencies and the health and safety risks to First Responders. This program addresses the common hazards associated with water rescue emergencies, as well as, the First Responder's initial role, on-scene responsibilities, and Responder limitations. This course will assist to increase the First Responder's ability to maintain scene/rescuer safety and control. During this program, students are introduced to important safety procedures related to weather exposure and physiological conditions, near drowning, personal protective equipment, including PFD (Personal Floatation Devices), and initial action plan development for water rescue emergencies will also be presented in this program.

QUINT CONCEPT: STRATEGIES & TACTICS

FSC 106.001 CLASS IS ON SUNDAY PM (3HR CLASS)
PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS
GEAR: NONE

Truck Companies, regardless of whether they arrive on an aerial device, squad, or engine, are the "combat engineers" of fire attack operations. Likewise, Engine Companies are the primary tactical suppression resource for the fire ground commander. This course is designed for experienced firefighters and will introduce the student to the basic concept of the quint company. Topics include: organizing the roles and responsibilities of quint company services, selection and use of key operational options, apparatus placement strategies, fire ground size-up and foreseeability, and operational considerations for the quint apparatus.

SUNDAY 8 HR CLASSES

HEAVY TRUCK RESCUE (8 HR CLASS) (20 STUDENTS MAX)

FSC 0622.001 CLASS IS ON SUNDAY (8 HR CLASS)
PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER,
GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

This program addresses the hazards and resource demands for extrication emergencies involving large and heavy vehicles. Addressed in this program, are vehicle design considerations, weight distribution hazards, payloads, strength points, and special hazard considerations. The course teaches the student how to assess, stabilize, and access vehicles of greater size and weight. Students will learn how to address special resource needs encountered during extrication emergencies.

RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION SEMINAR

FSC 1010.001 CLASS IS ON SUNDAY (8 HR CLASS)
PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS
GEAR: NONE

This class is for both administrative and line officers as well as those individuals who are responsible to bring new members into the fire department. This course will provide some of the techniques to successful recruitment and retention programs that have shown a proven track record.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON CLASSES

SURFACE ICE RESCUE AWARENESS (SIRA)

FSC 0447.001 CLASS IS ON SATURDAY PM (2.5HR CLASS)
PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS
GEAR: NONE

To goal of this program is to provide the student with the initial necessary knowledge for responding to ice immersion emergencies. Surface Ice Rescue Awareness will provide the student with the knowledge to size up an ice immersion emergency, provide for rescuer safety, provide site control and scene management and determine the necessary additional resources needed to mitigate the emergency. Surface Ice Rescue Awareness will assist an organization with becoming NFPA 1670 compliant with Ice Rescue Awareness.

SOLAR PANEL AWARENESS FOR THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 0381.001 CLASS IS ON SUNDAY PM (4 HRS)
Description: This 4 hour course is intended for Emergency Responders, as well as, other private or municipal agencies. This course is an awareness level program covering system types, code compliant installations, associated hazards, and safe work practices near solar PV systems. The course will introduce students to solar PV system operation, components, design and recommended practices.

VEHICLE EXTRICATION STRATEGIES AND TACTICS (20 STUDENTS MAX)
FSC 2474.001 (CLASS IS SUNDAY 8HRS)
PREREQUISITES: STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course will provide an awareness level of information and skills as it pertains to vehicle rescue incidents. Topics will include general vehicle rescue function/operation; incident management of the vehicle accident/rescue incident; vehicle anatomy, design, and construction; recognition and control of hazards relative to a vehicle accident/rescue incident; and the tools and equipment used at a vehicle accident/rescue incident.

COURSE OFFERINGS

16 HOUR PROGRAMS

BASIC RIT

FSC 760.001 Class is on Saturday and Sunday PM (16 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 18YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course is designed to provide firefighters with the knowledge and skill objectives to safely perform rescue techniques to remove trapped or lost firefighters during deteriorating suppression activities. This course is for firefighters who are members of a RIT, and tasked with extrication responsibilities during structure fires. Included in this course: RIT Team roles and responsibilities, evaluation of case studies, function during suppression activities, lifting and moving techniques, extrication support needs, team building skills, and size-up techniques and structure layout. The fire fighter will also participate in "live" scenario based evaluations involving a down/trapped firefighter.

INCIDENT SAFETY OFFICER CLASS (ISO)

FSC 108.001 Class is on Saturday and Sunday PM (16 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 18YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

The Safety Officer's responsibilities fall into two clear cut categories: those associated with responding at the incident scene, and those associated with managing the day to day affairs of the department. The Incident Safety Officer (ISO) course is focused on the incident and the role the Safety Officer plays as part of the Command Staff. The target audience is Company Officers (CO) who are experienced in firefighter safety issues and are familiar with an Incident Command System, hazardous materials management, and related emergency operations. The program provides the student with the decision-making process and skills required to recognize unsafe acts and conditions and take appropriate corrective actions.

ARSON DETECTION FOR THE FIRST RESPONDER (ADFR)

FSC 0734.001 Class is on Saturday and Sunday PM (16 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 18YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

The course covers topics which fire suppression personnel must be familiar with in order to facilitate origin and cause determination and possible subsequent investigation of intentionally set fires. Upon successful completion the student will be able to provide a clear definition of the role of initial responder organizations and to provide essential knowledge to enable them to recognize the potential of an intentionally set fire, preserve evidence, and properly report the information to appropriate officials.

FLASHOVER RECOGNITION AND SURVIVAL IS A PA STATE FIRE ACADEMY ON THE ROAD PROGRAM. STUDENTS WILL EARN A CLASS CERTIFICATE FROM THE PSFA

There will be two (2) offerings for this program.

FSC 900.001 Saturday March 14, 2020

FSC 900.002 Sunday March 15, 2020

There is an additional 65.00 Lab Fee for this class that must be paid at the time of registration.

Flashover Recognition and Survival" (ZFRS)— is an 8-hour course designed to give the student the practical knowledge required to recognize and understand the phenomena called "flashover", how to identify "pre-flashover" conditions and deal with these conditions in a safe and controlled manner. The ultimate outcome is to avoid firefighters from becoming victims of this violent phenomenon. Two live fire evolutions inside the simulator are required for successful completion of this course.

STUDENTS MUST BE 18 YOA

ON THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

Class size is limited to 14 students

Firefighters that are going to apply for the program will need to demonstrate that they have successfully completed either the

- PA Entry Level Firefighter Training Program (ELIF) with live fire; OR
- PA Entry Level Firefighter Training Program (ELIF) with no live fire AND Structural Burn Session; OR
- Essential Basic Module (EBM) AND Structural Burn Session
- Or Firefighter I certification.

Copies of the certificate will need to be submitted with the Application.

Students will be required to have full Structural Firefighting Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) including SCBA with a spare cylinder.

SERV SAFE

FSC 947.001 Class is on Saturday and Sunday PM (16 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 18YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This course fulfills the Educational and Testing requirements of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture and other regional County Health Departments for Foodservice staff and manager sanitation certification.

There is an additional \$30.00 lab fee which covers the certification that is received with this class.

Basic Rescue Task Force

FSC 0724.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH EMR,EMT,Paramedic

Basic Rescue Task Force

This course is designed to introduce EMS, fire, and law enforcement to the rescue task force concept as it pertains to responding to active shooter scenarios or acts of aggressive deadly behavior. This two day course is will train responders personal safety, life-saving techniques, provider/patient movement, triage, and other important aspects of the concept. This concept allows EMS and fire to be partnered with law enforcement officers to enter secured areas and utilize their training to treat/transport injured individuals. This course offers both classroom and realistic scenario based exercises.

The basic fee for the MAMA Emergency Services Training Weekend is \$70.00 which includes facilities, expendable materials costs, lunch and refreshments both days. Any student who is not a resident of Pennsylvania must pay an additional \$40.00 (\$110.00 total).
