COURSE OFFERINGS

APPARATUS OPERATIONS

PUMP OPERATIONS I

FSC 420.001 PUOP

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE!

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose lines, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

PUMP OPERATIONS II

FSC 421.001 PUOA

PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

COURSE OFFERINGS

EMERGENCY SERVICES ENTRY LEVEL

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 2459.001

PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 14 YEARS OF AGE

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

This entry level course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment, tools and emergency lighting, and backing apparatus. This is the first of five levels (courses) in the curriculum

STUDENTS REPORTING TO CLASS WITHOUT THE REQUIRED TEXT BOOK AND WORK/SKILLS BOOKS WILL NOT BE ADMITTED AND THE WEEKEND REGISTRATION FEE WILL BE FORFEITED! ALL STUDENTS ATTENDING THIS PROGRAM WILL RECEIVE A MANDATORY READING ASSIGNMENT LETTER TO PREPARE FOR THIS PROGRAM IN ADVANCE!

OFFICER DEVELOPMENT

INTRODUCTION TO FIRE OFFICERSHIP

FSC 226.001 INFO

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTER OR EQUIVALENT AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

This course will give the student a basic overview of fire ground officer responsibilities, personnel issues, fire ground operations, and the development of a sound and effective administrative and fire ground organizational structure.

INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNIQUES FOR COMPANY OFFICERS

FSC 225.001 ITCO

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTER OR EQUIVALENT AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

FIRE POLICE CLASS

BASIC FIRE POLICE

FSC 242.001

PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

This course was designed to prepare persons selected to be fire police officers to know the initial legal requirements and to understand how to perform the basic duties of the position. This course explains for the NEED for fire police; their legal police power; personal and professional qualifications; their appointment and control; their general and special duties; and their limitations.

3 COURSE FIRE FIGHTING OPERATIONS PACKAGE

COMPLETE PACKAGE FSC1500.001

WATER RESCUE FOR THE FIRST RESPONDER AWARENESS LEVEL (PA FISH & BOAT COMMISSION)

This Course will be offered on Saturday

FSC 0580.001

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE

This course will provide information that the first arriving emergency services personnel will need at a water incident to recognize risks and dangers associated with water emergencies and take actions to ensure their safety. The course will address scene assessment, activation of emergency response system, evaluation of potential and existing water hazards, scene management, rescue vs. recovery, and personal safety measures.

Surface Ice Rescue Awareness

This Course will be offered on Saturday

FSC 0447.001

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE

This program discusses the characteristics of ice-related emergencies and the health risks to First Responders. This program addresses the common hazards associated with ice rescue emergencies. This course will increase the ability of the First Responder to maintain scene safety. The students will learn important safety procedures to prevent weather exposure and drowning. Personal protective equipment for ice rescue emergencies will also be presented in this program.

Electric Vehicle Safety for Emergency Responders

This Course Will be Offered on Sunday

FSC 0120.001

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: HEAD,EAR,EYE,FOOT,HAND Protection Required

This program contains information on hybrid and electric vehicle safety and technology upgrades, which may pose concerns with extrication efforts. This course covers basic vehicle safety and technology changes at an emergency response level. Operating systems, construction and safety features are discussed throughout the program. Safety features such as: air bag systems, seat belt pretension systems, fuel system and charging stations, safe work zones, low, medium, and high voltage systems, vehicle construction materials, hybrid vehicles, and passenger compartment upgrades. Changes to size-up, extrication techniques, and the use of a Field Operations Guide will also be presented in this program. This course was developed by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

MAY REGISTER FOR EITHER PART OF THIS 3 COURSE PACKAGE OR THE COMPLETE PACKAGE.

BUREAU OF FORESTRY TRAINING

BASIC WILDLAND FIRE FIGHTER – PA 130

FSC 632.001

WBFF

PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: FIRE, CONSTRUCTION OR CLIMBING HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP, EYE PROTECTION SUCH AS SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES, LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS. FIRE FIGHTING TURN OUT GEAR IS NOT SUITABLE FOR THIS CLASS.

This course will provide the student with the knowledge and skills needed to become a wildland fire fighter. Topics include: Organization and Fire Fighter Preparedness, Fire

RESCUE OPERATIONS

BASIC RAPID INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING

FSC 760.001

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTING - MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE
FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course is designed to provide firefighters with the knowledge and skill objectives to safely perform rescue techniques to remove trapped or lost firefighters during deteriorating suppression activities. This course is for firefighters who are members of a RIT, and tasked with extrication responsibilities during structure fires. Included in this course: RIT Team roles and responsibilities, evaluation of case studies, function during suppression activities, lifting and moving techniques, extrication support needs, team building skills, and size-up techniques and structure layout. The fire fighter will also participate in "live" scenario based evaluations involving a down/trapped firefighter.

BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS (BVRA)

FSC 178.001

BVRA

PREREQUISITES: NONE-MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR - EYE PROTECTION - SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

Upon completion of this course the student will have an understanding of vehicle rescue, hazards of vehicle rescue operations, the ICS phase of vehicle rescue and vehicle technology and design. This course is intended for personnel who need to have an awareness of vehicle rescue operations and how to assist at a rescue scene.

BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE OPERATIONS (BVRO)

FSC 177.001

PREREQUISITES: BVR AWARENESS STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR - EYE PROTECTION - SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

Upon the completion of this course the student will have reviewed hazards of vehicle rescue operations, ICS, and have an understanding of Hand tools, Access, Patient extrication, and the Post Rescue phases of vehicle rescue. This course is intended for personnel who have already taken the BVR Awareness course in the past. This course teaches the student the use of hand tools in vehicle rescue operations and how to access and package the patient at the accident scene. Post

ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE 2 (RORA)

FSC 339.001

PREREQUISITES: Age 18 and up, Rope / High Angle Rescue I (RORE)

Students in this course will be re-introduced to the various types of rescue equipment. Students will be trained in mechanical advantage systems, safeties, basic ascending, basic rappelling technique and tie-offs with a rappel rack, rope changes, and one person rescue. The students will perform a low angle raise and lower evolution simulating patient transport on embankments. Most of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles), CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND A CLASS III HARNESS.

FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE

FSC 414.001

DHSV

PREREQUISITES: BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE TECHNICIAN MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR - EYE PROTECTION - SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course builds upon the knowledge and skills acquired in the basic Vehicle Rescue Technician course to prepare the student to deal with rescue situations involving larger vehicles such as buses and large trucks. A written examination is administered at the conclusion of this course for certification as DOH Special Vehicle Rescue Technician.

3 COURSE FIRE FIGHTING OPERATIONS PACKAGE

COMPLETE PACKAGE FSC1500.002

MAY REGISTER FOR EITHER PART OF THIS 3 COURSE PACKAGE OR THE COMPLETE PACKAGE.

CHURCH FIRES AND FIRE GROUND SIZE UP

FSC 804.001 Class is on Sunday (4hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE

GEAR: NONE

Church fires present difficult resource challenges which require quick decision-making and thorough assessment. This program will address common challenges and hazards associated with these structures, as well as, resource selection and deployment strategies to manage these incidents. Risk management and reduction strategies will be addressed throughout the program. Firefighters must have a working knowledge of building construction types, construction materials, and associated hazards. Pre-planning is another key element for effective response strategies and its value for initial assessment strategies.

STORE, MERCANTILE, AND MALL FIRES

FSC 654.001 Class is on Saturday (8hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE

GEAR: NONE

This course is designed for those firefighters who protect stores, mercantile, plazas, and shopping malls in their areas. Topics covered are building construction in stores, fire fighting operations in stores and malls, supporting fire protection systems.

SOLAR PANEL AWARENESS FOR THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 381.001 Class is on Sunday (4hr Class) 16 YOA

This course is intended for Emergency Responders, as well as, other private or municipal agencies. This course is an awareness level program covering system types, code compliant installations, associated hazards, and safe work practices near solar PV systems. The course will introduce students to solar PV system operation, components, design and recommended practices.

COURSE OFFERINGS

FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS

FSC 205.001

ECOP

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I

FSC 209.001

TRCO

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER (ELIF). MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course will introduce the student to the basic duties of a truck company including hand and power tool operation, search and rescue, and ventilation. Truck Company support to Engine Company is also covered.

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION II

FSC 311.001

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

Through classroom and Practical exercises, the student will become more confident with the use of the self contained breathing apparatus. With this advanced training, the student will learn air conservation and other skills needed to function in more challenging situations. This advanced training will enhance the fire fighters capabilities, build their confidence in using the apparatus and prepare them for the more complex situations that they may encounter (i.e. rapid intervention team and restrictive horizontal and vertical spaces)

"FLASHOVER SIMULATOR"

FSC900.001 MARCH 15 & 16, 2014

COURSE FEE ALLOWS ATTENDANCE AT ONLY ONE OFFERING!

PREREQUISITES: INTRODUCTION TO SAFETY AND TRAINING, ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING and RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

The "Flashover Simulator" is a safe and realistic way to experience the actual conditions of fire behavior before and during a flashover. Topics include: fire behavior, nozzle techniques, and safety factors involving flashovers.

1. This course is not a Pennsylvania State Fire Academy course and they are not responsible for the course content.
2. Certificates for this course will not be issued by the Bucks County Community College or the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy.
3. Certificates will be issued by the MUNCY AREA MUTUAL AID (MAMA).
4. There is a \$65.00 lab fee for this course in addition to the \$65.00 registration fee (\$135.00 total) or (\$170.00) for out of state residents.
5. Fire fighters with health conditions that prevent them from doing normal fire fighting activities should not register for this course.
6. Due to the fact that live fire is used in the simulations, junior fire fighters may not register for this course. Must be 18 YEARS OF AGE!
7. Enrollment For This Course Is Limited To The First 20 Registrations Received.
8. Students will receive a letter from the Muncy Area Mutual Aid fire training committee confirming your registration and providing additional information.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA, LONG SLEEVED COTTON SHIRT AND PANTS

STRUCTURAL FIRE RESCUE

FSC 325.001

SFR

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course will instruct the students in methods of rescuing victims from buildings under fire conditions. Topics discussed and practiced are search procedures, victim handling techniques, and methods of removing victims from above and below grade situations.

FORCIBLE ENTRY

FSC 700.001

TFE

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

ATTENTION! THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL \$65.00 LAB FEE FOR EXPENDABLE ITEMS TO BE CUT AND FORCED FOR THIS PROGRAM. A TOTAL OF \$135.00 PER STUDENT TO ENROLL IS REQUIRED WHEN YOUR REGISTRATION FORM IS SUBMITTED.

4 COURSE Hazardous Materials Operations PACKAGE

COMPLETE PACKAGE FSC1500.003

MASS DECONTAMINATION

FSC 497.001

PREREQUISITES: Hazardous Materials Operations: CORE and PPE . MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This program shall be to provide the operations level responder assigned to perform mass decontamination at hazardous materials / WMD incidents with the knowledge and skills to safely and effectively perform the tasks in accordance with NFPA 472 6.3.1.2.2.

AIR MONITORING

FSC 363.001

PREREQUISITES: Hazardous Materials Operation: Core and PPE MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

Through classroom sessions and practical fieldwork, this course will reinforce with the knowledge and skill objectives in order to function safely and effectively in a hazardous atmosphere. In addition, the student will understand, select, and operate various types of atmospheric monitoring equipment on simulated exercises. Subjects to be covered include identification of the various IDLH atmospheres, procedures for the selection and operation of air monitoring equipment, equipment decontamination procedures, data interpretation and management, and integrated monitoring exercises.

INCIDENT RESPONSE TO TERRORIST BOMBINGS - AWARENESS LEVEL

FSC 668.001

PREREQUISITES: **Hazardous Materials Operations Level or Hazardous Materials Operations - CORE Age 18 and up,**

This is an awareness level course designed to provide the student with basic information concerning explosive and incendiary devices that could be used as terrorist weapons. The course is comprised of classroom presentations designed to familiarize the student with commercial and military explosives, improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and appropriate response procedures. Specific departmental/agency policies will also be discussed.

TERRORISM AWARENESS DOMESTIC PREPAREDNESS

FSC 751.001

PREREQUISITES: Age 16 and up GEAR: None

This course is designed to enable emergency responders to be aware of the potential threat posed by terrorists using weapons of mass destruction in urban, rural, and suburban locations. The potential impact on first responders is addressed in this course.

COURSE OFFERINGS

4 COURSE SPECIAL MED / TRAUMA EMS CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS PACKAGE

FSC 902.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH FR or EMT-B or EMT-P

GERIATRIC EMERGENCIES

This course will explain the special considerations of assessing the medical and trauma emergencies unique to the geriatric population.

PATIENT ASSESSMENT—REVIEW AND EXPANSION:

This course reviews scene size up and safety considerations as well as performing an initial assessment of a patient.

REHABILITATION AWARENESS

This course will explain how to establish and operate a rehabilitation center for emergency providers who are operating

RESPIRATORY EMERGENCIES

This course reviews the structure and function of the respiratory system, emergency medical care procedures for respiratory distress and identifies the various signs and symptoms.

STUDENT WILL BE REGISTERED FOR ALL 4 COURSES.

CONFINED SPACE RESCUE

FSC 324.001

PREREQUISITES: ROPE 1, RESPIRATORY PROTECTION 1, MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE,

GEAR: GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles) , CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS

This course will provide the students with knowledge for plans of operation, tools, labor resources and manipulation skills required to perform safe removal of victims from limited space confinement. Emphasis is placed on safety and the psychological effects of confined space rescue. Students will participate in team rescue scenarios.

Prerequisites are REQUIRED for a particular course to ensure that the student has a basic understanding of the knowledge and skills that are necessary to complete the requirements of a course. When a chief or supervisor signs the authorization for a student to attend a class, he or she is attesting that the student has the background necessary to complete the requirements of the course. Students must complete all requirements of a class in order to receive a certificate.

STUDENTS REGISTERING FOR COURSES WHICH HAVE PREREQUISITE REQUIREMENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO BRING COPIES OF THEIR CERTIFICATES TO CLASS ON SATURDAY MORNING. INSTRUCTORS WILL VERIFY THAT THE STUDENT IS QUALIFIED TO ATTEND THE COURSE.

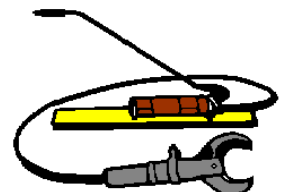
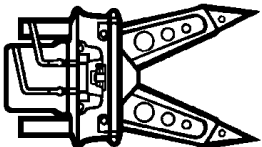
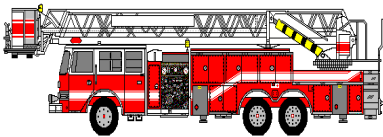

PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS FEBRUARY 24, 2014

Applicants must be the posted years of age or older by the first date of class. All students must be authorized by their chief or supervisor to attend. Junior fire fighters may not enroll in any course which involves live fire or live fire smoke. The Pennsylvania State Fire Academy policy on facial hair will be strictly enforced.

REGISTRATIONS FOR ALL COURSES WILL BE HANDLED BY BUCKS COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, YOUR EDUCATIONAL PROVIDER. The basic fee for the MAMA Emergency Services Training Weekend is \$70.00 which includes facilities, expendable materials costs, lunch and refreshments both days. Any student who is not a resident of Pennsylvania must pay an additional \$40.00 (\$110.00 total). All registrations MUST be accompanied by a check or money order drawn to B.C.C.C. or a credit card account number (must include 3 digit V code) or company/department purchase order number.

Students who register for the SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE, FORCIBLE ENTRY CLASS OR FLASHOVER SIMULATOR are required to pay an additional \$65.00 lab fee (\$135.00 total for PA residents or \$175.00 total for out of state residents.). Students who register for the BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS OR BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE Operations are required to pay an additional \$30.00 lab fee (\$100.00 total for PA residents or \$140.00 for out of state residents).

No telephone registrations will be accepted. Only students paying by credit card or company/department purchase order may fax their registration to 215-343-6794. Pre-registration is necessary and should be done EARLY. Class sizes are limited in number and are filled on a first come basis. Students are requested to select up to three of the two day seminars in order of priority. Applicants should only select courses that they desire to be enrolled in. ANY COURSE MAY BE CANCELLED DUE TO INSUFFICIENT ENROLLMENT OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES.

In case of course cancellation or if a course is filled, students are automatically placed in the next class choice indicated on the registration form. If another choice is not indicated on the form, the student's registration fee will be returned. Students will be notified of course cancellations or any other changes as soon as possible.
